In one week, two tragedies occurred thousands of miles apart. In Central America days of rain sent walls of mud sliding down mountainsides, burying villages. In South Asia, villages were flattened when the earth shook more violently than it has in the last century. Now, in the aftermath survivors are left grieving their lost loved ones, and repairing broken lives.

Central America

Days of unrelenting rain from Hurricane Stan in early October 2005 spawned severe flooding and killer mudslides in Guatemala, El Salvador, and Mexico. With more than 1,000 feared dead in Guatemala alone some villages have been completely destroyed and declared mass graves. Survivors are left destitute as aid agencies work to bring assistance through treacherous territory.

UMCOR is working with established local partners to provide hope in the form of food, water, clothing, and shelter to of displaced families in Tecpán, Patulul, and Chimaltenago, Guatemala. UMCOR is also working with GBGM missionary Eunice Arias to establish a long term recovery plan.

South Asia

The 7.6 magnitude earthquake that rocked Pakistan and surrounding countries killed an estimated 30,000 and displaced millions more just as the bitter Himalayan winter approaches.

UMCOR is working through local partners, International Blue Crescent (IBC) and Church World Service (CWS) to provide immediate assistance and long term recovery. Both organizations are engaged in giving medical assistance, food, and shelter to tens of thousands of survivors.
